Executive Summary

Our Ministry

Foursquare Missions Press provides churches and ministries around the world with **free** Gospel resources, primarily for developing nations that cannot afford basic materials to win the lost and strengthen believers.

The Press creates, prints and ships millions of pieces of literature annually, along with providing resources from various partnerships. These include audio, visual and other printed Gospel materials.

Fulfilling the Great Commission

The Press is committed to the ultimate goal of fulfilling the Great Commission. We believe our part is to resource the mission field by following the charge of the Foursquare denomination's founder and commit "to worldwide interdenominational evangelism." Historically, we have supplied dozens of ministries and denominations with free Gospel resources. Our printing ministry alone has shipped over **165,000,000** tracts, booklets and books to **110** different countries.

A Great Omission

The mission field lacks culturally relevant Gospel materials. A large majority of churches in developing nations either cannot afford basic materials or they are not available. The Press' purpose is twofold: provide free materials and continually develop both indigenous & culturally effective materials.

The lack of resources extends especially to the young. Youth With a Mission founder Loren Cunningham is quoted as saying, "95% of all children's Gospel resources and training go to North America alone." In response to the pleas from the field for children's materials, Missions Press created the Children's Gospel Box, which provides a wide array of children's resources and training.

A Great Competition

The fields "are ripe unto harvest." Yet, there is, in a real sense, a battle for souls. Whether it is the King Faud Center for the Printing of the Holy Quran that prints hundreds of millions of Korans and tracts annually or the huge printing complexes of both the Mormons and Jehovah's Witnesses, the competition is real and fierce.

We must provide our front lines with the best tools to reap the harvest. The United States has been blessed financially above all other nations, but with that blessing comes responsibility.

"And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing." Genesis 12:2

A pastor from Benin, Africa implored the Press with these words: "We have the soldiers (pastors) who are willing to die for the Gospel's sake. What we need is the ammunition, we need literature."

Current Projects Pending

The Cabecar Bible –Total cost of project – \$75,000

The Press has been asked to print the very first Bible of an Indian tribe in Costa Rica. Each Bible will cost \$4 apiece. Initially we will print 20,000 Gospel of Johns @ \$.75 apiece.

Cambodian Illustrated Bible –5,000 Bibles @ \$6.50 apiece. Total cost of project \$32,500

A full-color, completely illustrated Bible for the Cambodian people.

Children's Gospel Box –Total cost of project per crate \$7000 (average) \$175 per C-G Box

Gospel Boxes are needed in many different nations. Each Box contains resourcing materials to start a Sunday School program and enough Gospel tracts to reach 750 kids. Cost of Box includes shipping and material training expense.

Children's Gospel Box – Honduras –Total cost of project \$35,000

The specific project is focused on sending 600 Boxes to Honduras to resource 600 small “mini” churches that target children. Additional Boxes are needed for children’s workers throughout Central America.

Burundi Visual/Audio Project –Total cost of project \$37,000

The Press is partnering with Hosanna/Faith Comes by Hearing to produce both printed and audio tracts in the language of kiRundi to reach illiterate people with the Gospel.

Promise Pac/Teen Resources –Total needed for the project \$27,500

Partnering with the Hispanic youth group from The Church On The Way, the Press is providing printed and website resources to 80 identified youth groups in Central America.

New Press –Total needed for the project \$800,000

Missions Press needs to purchase a new 5-color press to fulfill its 5-year plan to triple production. Currently need \$375,000 to complete.

Used Books/Bible Drive –Total needed for the project \$25,000

The Press collects used books and Bibles from across the United States to ship to Bible schools in developing nations. There is a need for shipping partners.

Various Overseas Shipments –Average cost per shipment is \$1,200

The Press collects used books and Bibles from across the United States to ship to Bible schools in developing nations. There is a need for shipping partners.

One Million to Indonesia –Total needed for the project \$59,100

Partnering with 12,000-plus church movements in Indonesia, the Press will provide a million pieces of evangelism and discipleship literature.

Ministry Highlights

1981 Karl and Leona Williams, responding to the cry from the mission field for free Gospel literature, rent a small garage in Downey, CA. and begin on a used one-color press.

1986 The ministry moves to larger facilities in Paramount, CA. The Press is staffed by many volunteers.

1995 Reached the 100,000,000 piece of free literature.

1996 Press Founder Karl Williams goes home to the Lord.

2001 Move facilities to Norwalk, CA.

2002 Press establishes the Children's Gospel Box ministry that trains and resources children's workers around the world.

2004 Prints and ships the 150 millionth piece of literature for the mission field.

2005 Launch "used Bible and book" drive to U.S. churches, and becomes a supplier of thousands of used books to the mission field.

2006 Press Co-Founder Leona Williams joins husband Karl in glory. The Press sends out their 1500th Children's Gospel Box.

2007 Prints literature for the 110th different country and reaches 50th language.

2008 Move to Anaheim, CA. Begin new resource ministry to youth workers to reach teenagers in Central America.

The Press Today

The Ministry

The purpose of Foursquare Missions Press is to resource (and train how to effectively use these resources when needed) the church global, focusing on “developing” nations.

To accomplish this purpose, the Press creates, prints and distributes millions of pieces of Gospel materials annually. It partners with other resource agencies to provide other printed, visual and audio materials.

Since 1981, the Press has printed over 165 million pieces of literature for 110 countries in 51 languages.

In addition, the Press has created programs specific to resourcing and training children’s and youth workers in over 25 countries — an estimated 2,500 workers.

Strategically partnering with many other Christian organizations devoted to spreading the Gospel worldwide, the Press operates with a heart for the lost and a passion to strengthen the saved. Founded by the late Karl and Leona Williams, the Press is headquartered in Anaheim, California.

The Opportunity

Historically, the Press has resourced primarily the Foursquare movement around the world. This is an incredible network of tens of thousands of churches in over 140 countries. However, throughout the years, the Press has resourced other denominations, churches and ministries. The Press is, in the words of Foursquare founder Aimee Semple McPherson, “Dedicated to worldwide interdenominational evangelism.”

Ultimately, the Press working with the local indigenous leaders provides an opportunity for all peoples to read, hear and see the message of Jesus Christ in their own language.

The Strategy

- Print various tracts, booklets and books in 51 different languages that win the lost and strengthen the saved.
- Collaborate internationally with ministry partners to expand the type of resources needed.
- Equip field personnel with training (when needed) as to how to most effectively utilize the resources.
- Partner with U.S. and Canadian churches to provide all of these resources, shipping and training, free of charge to the Field.
- Work closely with missionaries and National Leaders to continually create new and culturally effective materials.

The Partnership

A large majority of churches on the field cannot afford even basic Gospel materials. They struggle to keep their doors open and, when possible, pay their pastor. Gospel materials are necessary tools that either do not exist in their country (we often develop them) or are too expensive to purchase.

Therefore, the Press seeks to partner with various churches, foundations and individuals for the purpose of providing all of their materials **free of charge**.

We are unique in that we continually “customize” materials acutely aware that “one size does not fit all.” Though this increases cost, our ability to develop new material specific to a region, or our eagerness to translate into new languages, makes our materials, more culturally sensitive, and therefore more effective.

Key Results

Stimulate and Resource Worldwide Evangelism

With Press tools ranging from a simple tract to the JESUS Film for Children, we estimate conservatively over **200 million*** men, women and children have read, heard or seen the salvation message in their language since 1981.

Stimulate Spiritual Development for New Believers and Future Current Leaders

Over 25% (40 million-plus pieces) of all our materials have been produced to assist the new believer, train young leaders and provide resources to pastors/leaders.

Creation of New Literature

The Press uniquely produces new, indigenous literature in response to a specific need from the mission field. Dozens of new products are created in partnership with international leaders.

Reach into Closed Areas

“Paper missionaries” can often reach into regions closed to the Gospel. The Press has partnered with dozens of ministries to send tons of materials into Muslim and Communist countries.

Stimulate Children and Youth Evangelism and Discipleship

The Children’s Gospel Box and Teen Promise Pac programs are designed not only to resource, but train local workers. Over 2,500 workers globally have been impacted since 2002.

Partnerships for Distribution

The Press, besides partnering with the global network of Foursquare churches, resources many other denominations, local churches and parachurch organizations.

Partnerships for Resources

Mission Press utilizes the materials and resources of many different groups, including the JESUS Film Project, E3 Resources, Faith Comes by Hearing, International Bible Society, Lukens Bible Stories and many more.

Cost Effectiveness

Through the use of many volunteers, rent-free space, and other cost-saving measures, the Press can put the salvation message into the hands of the unsaved for less than 5 cents. The Press also gives the new believer, young or old, the opportunity to grow strong through study for a quarter. Because of this low cost, materials can be produced by the millions and given away for free to provide workers on the ground something that clearly communicates both textually and visually the Gospel message.

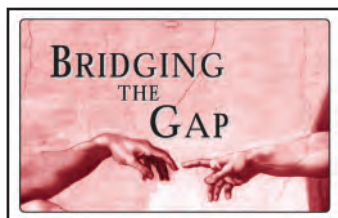
*Based on numerous conversations with workers on the field, literature usually is passed from one person to another and within the family. One African missionary told us he believes that one tract reaches on average 5 people.

This full-color 33-page booklet is considered the most effective evangelistic literature in Cambodia. Written and created by Cambodians in collaboration with Missions Press.



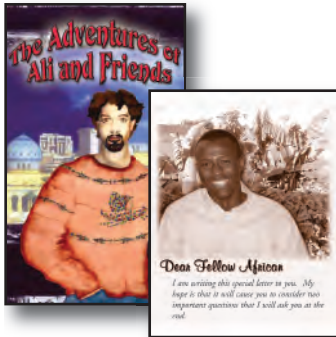
For Teens

Specifically for teens, this 16-page tract, created by a missionary in England, has won thousands to the Lord.



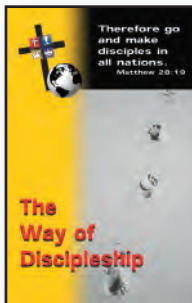
For Children

A full-color 24-page booklet originally created for the JESUS Film for Children, has been translated by Missions Press into 10 languages.



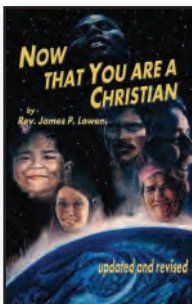
For Specific Region and Religion

Both of these pieces were created in collaboration with experts to reach Muslims in Africa and the Middle East.



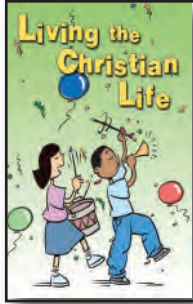
For Discipleship and Leadership Training

We currently offer 16 discipleship and leadership books and booklets in many different languages.



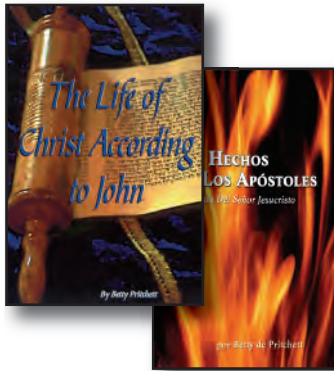
For New Believers

JESUS Film for Children – DVD

One of the greatest visual/audio tools to reach children. Campus Crusade created the original JESUS Film using child actors to tell the story from a child's perspective. These same actors give the audience the opportunity to receive Christ at the end of the movie.



Faith Comes By Hearing – Proclaimer

The Proclaimer is a digital player dedicated to playing God's Word in the local heart language. It was developed primarily as a playback device for the poor and illiterate who may not have any other source to hear God's Word. The sound is digital quality and loud enough to be heard clearly by groups as large as 300. The battery will play for 15 hours and can be recharged enough times to play the entire New Testament more than 1,000 times. An installed microchip contains Scriptures in the heart language, and will not erase or wear out from frequent playing.



Lukens Bible Flannels

Even in this digital age, felt visuals continue to provide a quality visual experience for children and an effective tool for teachers. Lukens is the most comprehensive Bible story flannel producer.

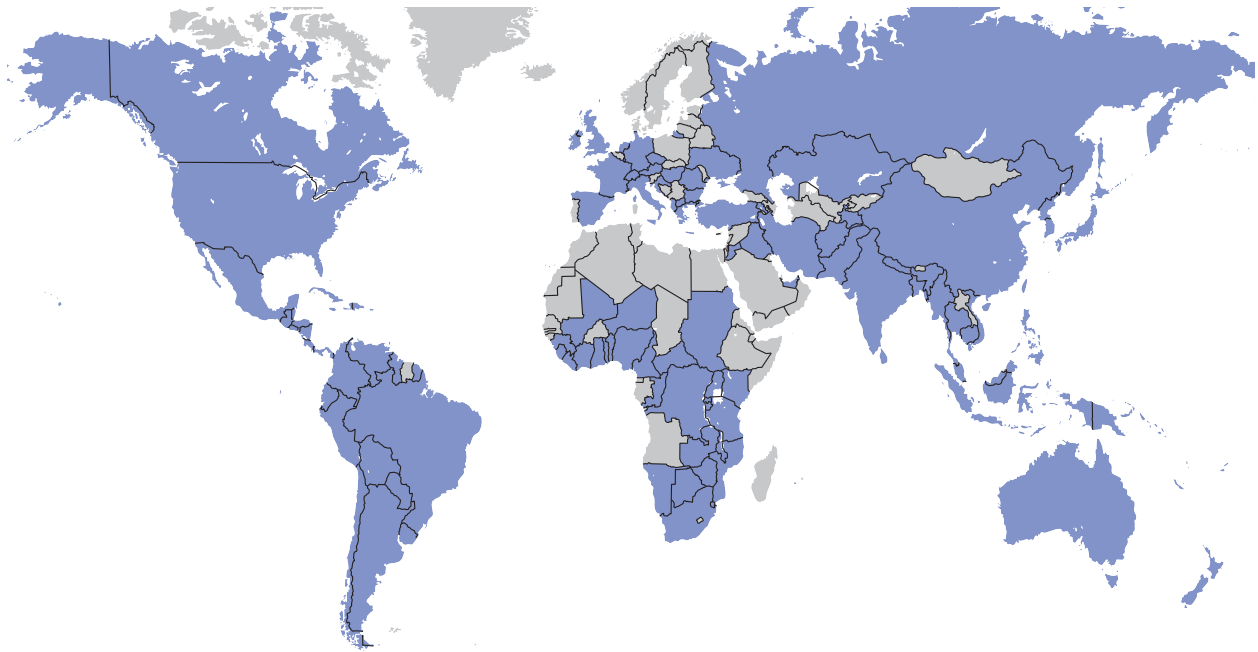

Exhibit E

The Children's Gospel Box (for children ages 5-12)

Starting in 2002, the Children's Gospel Box began resourcing and training children's workers living in developing nations.

The program was initiated from the constant cry for children's Gospel materials by the mission field.

Each Box contains materials such as Lukens Bible flannels, the JESUS Film for Children, wordless book and bracelet, various visuals, EvangeCube, curriculum and evangelistic and follow-up tracts/booklets.

Most importantly, each Box is only given out after a children's worker receives training on each of the Box's components and experiences a real "hands on" children's rally.

Since its beginning, the C-G Box program has trained some 2,500 children's workers in over 25 countries.

On confirmed salvations, we have seen an average of 7 children saved through each Box.

The Promise Pac (for youth ages 13-21)

After the success and effectiveness of the Children's Gospel Box, the Press researched the specific resource needs of youth workers. Promise Pac leaders interviewed 80 youth pastors from three Central American countries to ascertain resource needs.

The Promise Pac is a response to that need. Teenagers around the world respond to a specific type of literature. We are currently endeavoring to create more such literature. Additionally, the increasing use of the Internet has challenged us to create a website that links youth pastors together and provides them additional resources. The initial pilot program was initiated in 2008.

5-Year Plan

Looking Back

In 2000, we established five goals to provide the main ministry thrust of Foursquare Missions Press. These goals were critical in our growth, leading, for example, to the establishment of a Children's Gospel Box.

At Foursquare Missions Press, we believe it is important to be accountable to our supporters in regard to our past, present, and future. We take very seriously the stewardship of these gifts, which have doubled over the last nine years. We now operate on approximately \$600,000 per year. We have two full-time staff; seven part-time staff, and numerous volunteers who produce annually more than five million tracts, booklets and books (more than 160,000,000 since 1981). Our production also includes the Children's Gospel Box ministry (nearly 2000 C-G Boxes since August, 2002).

We know that the Lord has given to us vision as well as provision. We are extremely grateful to the many churches and friends that have been faithful to the prompting of the Holy Spirit to partner with us. **“To God Be the Glory Great Things He Hath Done.”**

Looking to the Present and Beyond

The Lord is stirring us again, giving fresh vision. We sense that His main encouragement is that we take this ministry to another level. In the prayerful words of Jabez in I Chronicles 4:10, we are to **“enlarge my (our) territory.”**

We believe that God's heart is to give every one of His faithful servants on the mission field the tools they need to bring in the harvest of souls and to feed His sheep. These tools may be evangelism and discipleship literature, used Bibles or other books, children's resources, or materials for teens. And these tools must be available to those on the field laboring in the middle of the harvest. Just as a Cambodian farmer cannot afford a new tractor, neither can a Cambodian pastor pay for Christian literature and resources. **We must provide them the tools they need free of cost.**

This was the original vision of Foursquare Missions Press founders, Karl and Leona Williams, who acted on the directive of Foursquare's founder, Aimee Semple McPherson, to be **“dedicated to the cause of interdenominational worldwide evangelism.”**

The Press will continue this legacy of giving materials to various ministries and churches that are in need and effectively preaching the gospel. However, because of our historic partnership with Foursquare Missions we have direct access to more than 140 nations, from missionaries and regional leaders to local pastors and children/teen workers.

We sense that the Lord is directing our focus to seven key goals for growth in the next five years:

Seven Goals for the Next Five Years

#1 *Tripling our annual production of literature from 5 million to 15 million*

To put it in ministry terms, we want to triple the number of souls saved, believers disciplined, and leaders raised up. We have identified strategic regions and are in the process of developing appropriate materials and strategies:



- Increasing shipments to Africa, especially the poorer French-speaking nations
- Increasing shipments to Asia, especially nations such as Vietnam, Cambodia, Thailand, and Philippines
- Increasing shipments to Latin America for large scale evangelism and necessary follow-up materials
- Expanding our follow-up literature ministry with more in-depth training booklets, correspondence courses, etc.

#2 *Tripling our outreach to the most difficult and unreached regions of the world*

The Press will continue to get materials to closed and semi-closed countries such as Israel (Palestine area), Tajikistan, Vietnam, Myanmar, and Iraq. Our goal is to expand to countries such as Mongolia, Turkey, and Iran through highly specific, culturally relevant literature:

- Continuing to work directly with the “underground” leaders and missionaries to create, print and distribute new materials
- Creating new partnerships with leaders and ministries who touch the unreached but lack relevant resources
- Continuing to translate existing materials into new languages, and creating new materials in partnership with local leaders/missionaries
- Creating children’s materials specifically for these nations and adapting the C-G Box Ministry where possible, and continuing the successful partnership with JESUS Film Project

#3 *Tripling the number of children's resources (Children's Gospel Box Ministry) sent to developing nations*

Some estimate that 95 percent of children's resources and finances go to benefit North American children. We must greatly increase our efforts to the rest of the world, especially the poorer nations:



- Creating and distributing 2,400 Children's Gospel Boxes each year
- Seeing at least 30,000 salvations each year among those who receive the literature
- Training and providing resources for 5,000 children's workers each year from developing nations (We want to have all the C-G Box training and various materials accessible from our Website; using various "coaches" to help individual churches do children's ministry.)

#4 *Creating new literature resources and training to reach teenagers around the world*

One of the largest growing segments of the world's population is teenagers, and we want to increase our teen-specific resources:

- Creating a resource and training ministry like the Children's Gospel Box for teen leaders
- Creating unique teen literature/message access via the Internet
- Partnering with youth groups across America to link with youth groups/leaders in developing nations

#5 *Becoming the nationwide leader in exporting used Bibles and Christian books to churches around the world*

We annually send over 1,000 used Bibles and other books to Africa, the Caribbean, and Philippines. Hundreds of Bible schools in these regions desperately need materials, and we want to increase our support by:

- Sending more than 10,000 Bibles and other books annually
- Working with publishing companies and Christian schools to facilitate their donation of materials

#6 *Creating dozens of new tracts and booklets to reach specialized ministry needs*

The Press desires to partner with ministries to reach people in all walks of life:

- Creating and distributing tracts to reach the homeless, addicted, and other “street” people
- Creating tracts/booklets to reach Native Americans and other ethnic minorities
- Creating tracts for U.S. churches to reach local non-English speaking people from other countries (The world is coming to America – we cannot communicate if we do not know their language. Warm, friendly tracts in people’s “heart” languages would help us evangelize.)

#7 *Playing a leading role in prayer for missions*

Critically important to our 5-year plan is prayer. We have created a chapel in our facilities that is devoted to prayer for missionary efforts. This includes prayer for the entire Foursquare family and other ministries. Our efforts will be directed to all nations:

- Linking intercessory groups together throughout the nation
- Communicating to our missionaries, national leaders, and pastors that we are praying for them
- Using technology to link prayer groups from various nations
- Praying that the printed Word will reach millions and set them free



How can we achieve these seven goals in five years?

1. *We will need more equipment.*

We must have a new press if we are to increase production. Our two current presses are limited. The press we need costs approximately \$850,000 and will alone triple our production capabilities. We also need a folding machine that will cost approximately \$60,000.

2. *We will need more space.*

Our current facility is close to capacity; with a new press and a growing “used Bible/book distribution center,” we must have additional space.

3. *We will need more staff and volunteers.*

We run “lean and mean,” but we must hire additional personnel to reach our goals. We also want to provide more opportunities for people to volunteer.

4. *We will need more funding.*

Tripling production will mean additional costs. We must increase and expand our donor base both within and outside the Foursquare family. More than two thirds of the U.S. Foursquare churches currently do not give to our ministry. We hope to increase contributions from Foursquare churches through more effective communication.

5. *We will need more prayer.*

Putting together a volunteer prayer team that is linking with other prayer groups nationwide will supplement our staff prayers. **We are convinced that our ministry effectiveness is directly linked to prayer.** Our hope is to have intercessors praying throughout our facilities every day.
